In June of 2022 during St. John's Day Grand Master Richard J. Kessler and the Trustees of the Masonic Hall and Asylum Fund broke ground for the site of a special Veterans Memorial Garden to be built at MCC.

The Veterans Memorial Garden at the Masonic Care Community will honor the legacy of American military veterans. The Garden will be a peaceful area dedicated to all five United States Uniformed Services and their respective Guard and Reserve Units - Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard. Veterans, military members, their families and friends will have a sense of pride in knowing the community cares, honors, and respects our veterans' dedication, sacrifices, and service.

War memorials are a dynamic force in society, showing the impact war has on the nation. The most tragic consequences of war are loss of life, and the maiming of body and spirit. Supporting the Veterans Memorial Garden helps provide a place for reflection, healing, sharing of experiences, and education.

Masons have an especially strong tradition of supporting our men and women in uniform. The Veterans Memorial Garden will be a historical legacy that honors this long-standing tradition of supporting our troops.



American Eagle Statue

The American bald eagle was adopted as the national bird symbol of the United States in 1782. The bald eagle was chosen for its majestic beauty, great strength, long life, and because it's native to North America. Once an endangered species, the bald eagle is an extraordinary conservation success story. The American Bad Eagle also symbolizes freedom, and it reflects and honors all veterans that served to protect the freedoms of everyone that lives in the United States of America.

Branch of Service Area Dedications

\$2,000 Donation per Section

There will be five sections of the Veterans Memorial Garden for each branch of the United States Military. These key areas of the Garden provide a gift opportunity for those that may have a very special connection to that particular branch of our Uniformed Services. Each of these areas will have the opportunity for donor-dedicated signage.

U.S. Army Garden Area: "This We'll Defend"

As the oldest branch of the U.S. military, the U.S. Army's motto is steeped in a long history of service to this country. The phrase "This We'll Defend" was first used by the War Office of the Continental Army during the American Revolution in 1778.

U.S. Marine Corps Garden Area: "Semper Fidelis" – Always Faithful

The U.S. Marine Corps motto, "Semper Fidelis," is legendary. However, "Semper Fi" (as it's yelled, cheered, or used as a greeting) is not just a motto for the Marines – it's a way of life. The phrase is Latin for "Always Faithful" and it embodies the Marine Corps' forever commitment to both their fellow Marines and the United States.

U.S. Navy Garden Area

"Not self, but country," is the phrase inscribed above the chapel doors of the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. This unofficial motto invokes the spirit of sacrifice that so many sailors and members of our Armed Forces carry with them through their service. The U.S. Navy continues to fearlessly serve the United States both at home and abroad.

U.S. Air Force Garden Area: "Aim High ... Fly-Fight-Win"

Formally adopted in 2010, the U.S. Air Force's motto of "Aim High ... Fly-Fight-Win" is both a call to action and a promise in response. The Air Force always pushes itself to new heights and expects its airmen to do the same.

U.S. Coast Guard Garden Area: "Semper Paratus" – Always Ready

For a military branch that is on-call 365 days a year to protect the waterways and people of the United States, the motto "Semper Paratus," that is, "Always Ready," is especially appropriate. No matter the rough waters, challenging ocean rescues, or long hours of ensuring national security, the U.S. Coast Guard is always ready to respond.














Bench Dedication \$5,000 Donation
